### National AIDS Control Program, Chikmagalur District

A National program on Prevention & control of HIV/AIDS is implemented from many years with different strategies. A clear vertical program was started from 14<sup>th</sup> Aug 2002. Counselling & testing centers were established in the District hospitals, slowly the numbers of centers were increased & at present 66 Counselling & Testing centers were functioning in the district. Treatment for the HIV infected people is also provided at the district hospital from 2008. Treatment for the Sexually Transmitted Infections is also made available at PHC level through Syndromic Case Management system. Increased & Promoted Voluntary Blood donation to avoid the risk of HIV transmission from transfusing safe blood. The educative, preventive & curative programs for the vulnerable groups like Female sex workers & Men sex with men is also functioning by providing grants to the NGOs/CBOs. The People Living with HIV & AIDSs are linked to many Social entitlement schemes with the coordination of other departments. With all these efforts we find there is decline in the stigma & discrimination attached with this disease.

## REVISED NATIONAL TUBERCULOSIS CONTROL PROGRAMME [RNTCP]

1. Tuberculosis, or TB is an infectious bacterial disease which most commonly affects the lungs. It is transmitted from person to person via droplets from the throat and lungs of people with the active respiratory disease.
2. Tuberculosis (TB) is a major public health problem in India. India accounts for one fifth of the global TB incident cases Each year nearly 20 lakh people in India develop TB of which year nearly 20 nearly 20 lakh people in in India develop TB, of which around 8.7 lakh are infectious cases.
3. Since 1993 the Government of India (GOI) has been implementing the WHO recommended DOTS strategy via the Revised National Tuberculosis Control Programme (RNTCP)
4. The disease spreads whenever patients cough or sneeze without covering their faces. Hence, patients should always cover their faces while coughing or sneezing.
